- Remember also to play your newest sonatas, concertos, and other pieces, every day! Sight-read daily, too, and remember your assignments from other material, including etudes and additional pieces. Improvise daily, also.
- Each time you play your repertoire songs and pieces, strive to make them still more beautiful than the last time you played them. You are a more advanced player now than when you first learned these. Bring your more advanced skills to your polished pieces. You also have grown as a person and therefore have more to communicate through this music. Consider what you want to say in each piece. How can you say it better?
- Are you playing with a excellent tone and a wide range of dynamics and expressive techniques?
- Does every aspect of your posture continue to be balanced and relaxed? Do not ignore your foundation. Rather, be the more diligent to keep it strong, the higher you build on it!
- For your scales and arpeggios, always play at least 3 octaves. Remember which position you are to use and where your shifts are. Also, use a variety of bowstrokes, rhythms, speeds, and numbers of notes per bow, always listening for ringing tone and accurate intonation.

• In addition to continuing to polish the melody, you may play any of the harmony parts you know, playing along with the CD. Also compose your own harmony parts, especially with pieces you have known for a long time. You may also transpose.
